

The common goal of his work is to learn the material and its limitations, creating his own tools and methods for pushing the material to new applications. He contrasts gloss with matte, texture with smoothness, and organic with geometric to create subtle textural shifts and unique experiences that are completely dependent on light and point of view.



## John David James

Self-taught and led by his own inquiries, Canadian artist (John) David James has absorbed mediums and subject matter in an artistic practice that has spanned more than thirty years. James' characterization of himself as a dilettante belies the fact that, as a painter, photographer, filmmaker, and musician, as well as a performance, sound and installation artist, he has made himself at home across a number of disciplines. James emerged in the late 1990s. His earliest works, in which he utilized the use of presenting art as the foundation to create his work, were based on a deep understanding of the conceptual ideology of the artist being both the creator and the viewer. His current practice makes use of photographs, collage, paint, and sculpture as he continuously inverts, re-mixes, and re-creates his images. Final pieces are most often presented as large-scale photographs of the work. Despite his prolific practice and having his work collected within Canada and beyond, he is just now becoming deliberate about exhibiting.

## Michael Floman


Michael Flomen was born in Montreal in 1952. He began making photographs in the late sixties and has been showing his work on several continents since 1972. He served as a darkroom printer and collaborator for many artists, including for the Jacques Henri Lartigue travelling exhibition that toured Canada and the United States in the mid seventies. Details, Flomen's first book of street photographs, which was inspired by Henri Cartier Bresson's formalist approach to picture taking, was published in 1980. Still Life Draped Stone, which includes black and white street photographs, followed in 1985. Flomen switched to a large-format camera in the early nineties in order to photograph snow, a project that led to the publication Rising issued in 2000. For the last twenty years, this self-taught artist has been using cameraless techniques to work directly in nature. Natural elements, including water, the light emitted by fireflies, wind, and other natural phenomena are the inspiration for his picture making. Michael Flomen's work is represented in thirty collections, including the George Eastman House, the Los Angeles County Museum of Art, the Musée du Québec, the National Gallery of Canada, the Norton Museum of Art, the Philadelphia Museum of Art, and the Whitney American Art.
